Design a time machine


Tilly's dad is a scientist and inventor who builds a time machine.


Have a go at designing your own time machine here.

If you could go back in time where would you go? Who would you like to meet?






Tilly visits the England v Germany World Cup final in 1966

Can you find out what the England and Germany football strips looked like and colour in the pictures below. Can you design you own football strip in your own colours?





My own football strip

Tilly meets two well-known people from history when she travels back in time. Draw their portraits in the frames and find out a few facts about each of them.








Tilly finds out a bit about life as a child chimney sweep and life at Buckingham Palace in Victorian times.

Draw a picture of Jack the chimney sweep or Tilly dressed as a chimney sweep. Then draw Tilly dressed up at the Palace.






Afternoon Tea
